Frank Juarez Sr., a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, and friend passed away on Sunday, February 25, 2024, in his hometown of Alice, Texas after a long battle with cancer. Frank was born to Pablo Juarez and Hermenia Zamora on September 17, 1938 in Alice, Texas and raised in the Rancho Allegre community.

Frank attended William Adams High School in Alice where he was a member of the fighting Alice Coyotes. Frank also played catcher for several traveling baseball teams in the surrounding area. It was at William Adams High School where Frank met the love of his life Alma.

After High School Frank enlisted in the U.S. Army and married Alma. Frank proudly served his country from 1959 to 1979 as a member of the Military Police Corps. Frank served in Korea and then in the Vietnam War. After his first tour of service in the Vietnam War where he participated in the Tet Offensive, known to be one of the largest campaigns in the Vietnam War, Frank selflessly volunteered his services for a second tour in Vietnam. Frank was assigned to an elite squad of Military Police Officers known as the Roadrunners who were assigned to patrol heavily travelled roads known to contain land mines and ambushes.

After Frank retired from the Army he became a small business owner, opening Juarez Drilling Fluids in Alice, Texas, servicing the local oil and gas industry. Frank also attended Texas A&I University and obtained a Bachelors' Degree

in Mathematics. Frank went on to teach math for the Alice Independent School District and Brownsville Independent School District. Frank also coached football, soccer, and golf. Frank went on to retire from teaching and served for several more years as a substitute math teacher for the Ben Bolt Palito Blanco Independent School District.

Frank was a member of the Knights of Columbus and served as President of La Sociedad Catolica de Las Mutalistas for several years. Frank and Alma also volunteered with the Boy Scouts of America where Frank was able to witness his eldest grandson achieve the honor of Eagle Scout.

Frank and Alma had 4 children; Frank / Julia Juarez Jr., Armando / Esther Juarez, Belinda / Pat Smith, and Nicolas / Martha Juarez. Frank and Alma also had 14 grandchildren; Armando / Terri Martinez, Arturo Wayne Martinez, Erika Smith, Gerald Smith, Brandon / Ashley Smith, Juan Linan, Frank / Anais Linan, Liliana Harley Juarez, Armando / Chloe Juarez Jr., Carlos / Megan Juarez, Amanda Juarez, Rocco / Kayla Juarez, Nicolas Juarez Jr., and Kaylyn Marie Juarez. Frank and Alma also had the joy of having 10 great grandchildren; Allezhae Juarez, Raelynn Smith, Kamila Juarez, RJ Juarez, Caleb Juarez, Arianna Martinez, Siarra Martinez, Arturo Martinez Jr., Maria De La Paz Linan, and Cate Marie Smith.

Frank's hobbies were whatever his grandchildren were doing, he never missed a game his grandkids played in and loved bowling nights where he competed in various bowling leagues. He is preceded in death by his loving wife Alma, his parents, his daughter Belinda, son-in-law Pat, and grandson Arturo Martinez. Frank will be missed and forever be remembered as a proud American who served not only his country but his community by teaching younger generations scholastics and sportsmanship. Most of all Frank will be remembered as a loving father and grandfather.
